I'm coming to camp! Now What?

Campers: Congratulations! You are registered for **Horse Camp 1** at Camp Koronis, **June 20-25**. We are excited you can join us for this week of fun, adventure—and horses! Each day during your time at camp (except Fri.) you'll spend almost 3 hours learning to ride & care for a horse chosen just for you at nearby *Flanders Ranch*. You'll spend the rest of your time at Camp Koronis where you'll make new friends, swim & boat on the lake, sing & cook-out around the campfire, make crafts, sleep-out in a

yurt, play group games, & grow in your relationship with God!

IMPORTANT: Specific guidance around COVID-19 protocols at camp will be provided prior to the start of your event. Please watch your email for messages from the camping office.

Parents: Our goal is to provide a camp experience that is imaginative, adventurous, and safe for every camper. Our college-age summer staff are people of strong faith and character, carefully vetted & trained with camper's wellbeing in mind. Camp Koronis also holds the distinction of being accredited by the *American Camp Association*, so your camper will experience Christ, Creation & Community in a quality environment.

What happens when I get to camp?

Arrival and Registration: Due to COVID-19, we will have drive-through check-in this year. Plan to arrive at camp between 3-4 PM and remain in your vehicle. Our staff will welcome you, collect necessary paperwork, spending money, and any remaining fees. You will also get to meet the camp nurse, hand in any medications, and drop off your luggage. Then a staff member will walk campers to their cabins where they'll get to choose a bunk (do you like top or bottom?), meet

their counselor & cabin-mates, and get their FREE backpack & water bottle. Make sure to bring, or have completed on-line, your:

-Health Form,
-Release of Liability,
-COVID-19 Release of Liability

At check-in you'll turn in:

- all Medication,
- any Spending Money

Parents: On the Health Form, please make sure that you list the people authorized to pick up your child (including yourself!). We can not release your camper

unless that person's name is on the health form and they have a picture ID.

-All medication must be in original containers labeled with name and dosage. Over the counter medication must also be turned in.

- Spending money, paid on-line or in-person, will be deposited in a "camper account" that can be used during camp at the canteen, camp store. Any unspent money will be returned at the end of camp.

Share camp with a friend & save! For each new camper you bring to camp, you'll save \$25 off your tuition. (Contact Camp MN at 855-622-1973 for details)

 - ◇ Towel & washcloth
 - ◇ Toiletries
 - ◇ Flashlight
 - ◇ Insect repellent
 - ◇ Sunscreen
 - ◇ Bible & Pen/Pencil
 - ◇ Jeans/pants & sturdy shoes for riding (Riding gear & helmets are provided)
- Bring or Complete On-line
- ◇ Health Form
 - ◇ Release of Liability
 - ◇ COVID-19 Release of Liability
 - ◇ Spending Money (\$10-\$20 is usually enough)
